I. Parties to MOU

This memorandum of understanding (hereinafter referred to as MOU) made and entered into on this the 9th day of April 2013 at Mumbai, India between **NMIMS University, Mumbai** having its office at Vile Parle, Mumbai 400 056 (hereinafter referred to as NMIMS University), which expression unless repugnant to the context or contrary to the meaning thereof, shall include the successors(s), administrator(s), or permitted assignees on the First part

AND

JSS University, Mysore, having office at Mysore 570 015, (hereinafter referred to as JSSU, Mysore), which expression unless repugnant to the context or contrary to the meaning thereof shall include the successors(s), administrator(s) or permitted assignees on the Second part

II. Preamble

Whereas NMIMS University and JSS University, Mysore are offering programmes in Pharmaceutical Sciences for the past several years:

Whereas the ideal of further development of a talent base for innovative thinking and research in Pharmaceutical Sciences and related disciplines, both for academic and industry positions has been engaging the attention of these institutions.

III. Agreement

Now, therefore for and in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants set out herein, NMIMS University, Mumbai and JSSU, Mysore hereby agree to sign this MOU to pursue INTER UNIVERSITY COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH PROGRAMMES IN PHARM SCIENCES and other areas as defined in this MOU and from time to time with mutual agreement.

The details of the Scheme envisaged presently are spelt out in the **Annexure** attached herewith.

IV. Other terms governing the scheme

All other terms governing the scheme will be decided between NMIMS University, Mumbai, and J.S.S. University, Mysore, on mutually agreeable conditions

V. Amendment

NMIMS University, JSSU, Mysore may by mutual agreement, decide to amend the terms and conditions of this MOU.

VI. Dispute Settlement

In the event of any differences or disputes arising out of or in connection with the interpretation and application of the provisions of this MOU, the parties shall immediately consult each other and resolve them in a spirit of mutual understanding and co-operation.



COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH WITH
CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE IN INDIAN UNIVERSITIES

Objectives

- To address the urgent need for unconventional and innovative approaches like collaborative research between Centres of excellences,
- To optimally utilize the expertise and infrastructure available at both ends
- To identify areas of expertise and of mutual interest of Centres of excellences, without disturbing the statutory requirement of their own offices and plan collaborative research so that the expertise and infrastructure can be utilized for quality research.
- To encourage Industry institute interaction

MODALITIES**Phase-I**

- Knowledge and expertise available, good research techniques developed in a specialized area can be shared with each other.
- Student faculty exchange programme, for short duration without affecting the academic hours can be considered to train and develop talent base in respective areas by way of short skill development programmes.
- Government, UGC, DST, DBT and AICTE are known to support and encourage such knowledge and resource sharing by providing large grants to consortium of Universities with known technical expertise.
- Geographical distribution and dissemination of information skill sets and sharing of expensive infrastructure along with expertise.
- A joint venture leading to Ph.D. degree of the respective University or industrial consultancy.

- Industrial strength available with the University can be shared so as to promote the industry institute interaction of other centres.
- The possibility of tie ups with industries in Karnataka and Mumbai, Maharashtra for collaborative research and consultancy can be explored.

After the implementation of Phase-I, based on the evaluation of results of various proposals mentioned above, Phase-II modalities may be considered for implementation.

Phase-II

- Universities can have a joint tie up for collaborative Ph.D. programme wherein student faculty can work at both the institutions under the guidance of guides identified at each centre.
- Necessary approvals required by the concerned University can be initiated after successful completion of Phase-I.
- Development of incubation centres, innovative approaches and also industrial consultancy.
