**Memorandum of Understanding
between
Jagadguru Sri Shivarathreeswara University
and
The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill**

Jagadguru Sri Shivarathreeswara (JSS) University in Mysore, India, and The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (UNC-Chapel Hill) in the United States of America, for the purpose of furthering cooperation in education, research, and other activity hereby enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (Memorandum) which affirms their intent to pursue a mutually beneficial relationship. This Memorandum has been initiated by the Colleges of Pharmacy at JSS University and the UNC Eshelman School of Pharmacy at UNC-Chapel Hill, but other units at each institution may also pursue the activities described below under the same terms of this Memorandum.

- I. To promote collaborative activity, both institutions may explore opportunities for cooperation in the following areas:
 - A. Development of academic programs and courses;
 - B. Exchange of academic staff and researchers for the purposes of teaching, training and/or research;
 - C. Exchange of students for the purposes of education and training;
 - D. Reciprocal assistance for visiting academic staff and students;
 - E. Coordination of such activities as joint research, teaching, and training;
 - F. Exchange of documentation, research materials, publications, and information in fields of mutual interest; and
 - G. Other activities of mutual benefit to both institutions.

The terms of any collaborative activity will be described and agreed upon in separate written agreements, which may be attached as addenda to this Memorandum. Both institutions acknowledge that any binding terms and conditions regarding their collaboration or cooperation, including but not limited to specific financial, administrative, scientific, intellectual property, and legal terms, will be set forth in separate written agreements, to be executed by authorized representatives of both institutions. Nothing in this Memorandum establishes an exclusive relationship between the institutions.

- II. This Memorandum does not bind either institution to any current or future financial commitment. Each institution will bear its own costs associated with preparation of this Memorandum.

- III. No person should be excluded from activities under this Memorandum on the basis of race, color, gender, national origin, age, religion, creed, disability, veteran's status, sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression.
- IV. Except in promoting the collaborative activities described above, neither institution may use the other's name or logo in any press release, fund-raising, website, product advertising, or for any other promotional or publicity purpose, without written permission from the other. In addition, written permission must be obtained to use the other's trademarks for any purpose.
- V. The institutions will comply with all applicable law and regulations with respect to activity under this Memorandum, including law related to anti-bribery, economic sanctions, export control, anti-boycott, privacy and data protection, higher education, and accreditation standards or procedures. Each institution acknowledges that activities under this Memorandum will be subject to all required approvals, accreditations, consents, licenses, or permits, from U.S. and non-U.S. governmental authorities, as well as internal approvals, as necessary to proceed with the activity.
- VI. Activities carried out under this Memorandum will be done without the disclosure of either institution's confidential or proprietary information to the other institution or to third parties. Should it become necessary for the institutions to disclose to each other confidential or proprietary information, the providing institution will notify the receiving institution in advance and in writing, and the institutions will agree on reasonable terms for the protection of such information. All confidential information will be clearly marked as such, or promptly disclosed as such, in writing.
- VII. Neither institution may assign or otherwise transfer this Memorandum, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of the other institution.
- VIII. This Memorandum does not establish a legal partnership, joint venture, employment relationship, or relationship of agency between the institutions. Neither institution may act as an agent on behalf of the other institution on any matter, including in matters with the other institution's national government.
- IX. In the event that a translation of this Memorandum is prepared or signed by the institutions, the English language version will govern in the event of a conflict between the English language version and the translation.
- X. No amendment to this Memorandum will be valid unless signed by authorized representatives of each institution.
- XI. This Memorandum will be effective on the date of the last signature for a period of five years. This Memorandum may be renewed upon the written agreement of both institutions, and may be terminated upon six months written notice by either institution. However, termination will not affect separate written agreements between the institutions (whether or not attached as addenda to this Memorandum) which will be governed in accordance with their terms.






