Regular activities:

3) **Doctors silent protest rally:** The NSS unit of JSS medical college in collaboration with the

This convention was a joint venture of JSS Medical College in association with World Heart Academy (WHA) International Society of Cardiovascular Ultrasound, USA (ISCU), American Association of Cardiologists of Indian Origin, USA (AACIO), CSI Delhi Branch, Indian Academy of Echocardiography (IAE), J.S.S University, Defence Research and Development Organization, Govt. of India (DRDO), World Wellness Foundation, (WWF), ASSOCHAM and SCOPE. The NSS wing of JSS Medical College was instrumental in conducting a health camp on this account. It was held at the Suttur School premises and was a half day camp. It was inaugurated by his holiness in the presence of organisers and delegates. The team of consulting doctors included physicians, cardiologists and haematologists from JSS Hospital. Camp was for the benefit of the people of Suttur and nearly 600 people availed the services offered free of cost. The services extended were CBG, general consultation, ECG and ECHO which were all done free of cost. NSS volunteers played an important role in the conduct of the camp as they checked the height, weight and measured blood pressure. 6) World rabies day-2013: National Services Scheme Unit of JSS Medical College, Mysore in

collaboration with Department of Community Medicine observed World Rabies Day- 2013 at post graduate department of Social Work, JSS College of arts, commerce and science, Ooty road, Mysore on 30th September 2013. On this occasion, Rabies Awareness Programme to Social Work students was organized. Dr. M P Somashekhar, HOD, Post graduate department of Social Work, welcomed the gathering and explained the relevance of rabies awareness to social work students.



Dr. N C Ashok, Professor and Head, Department of Community Medicine introduced the themes and objectives of world rabies day mentioning his professional experiences of treating animal bite cases. Dr. HugaraSiddalingappa, Assistant professor of Community Medicine, deliberated on history and epidemiology of Rabies, he mentioned more than 50,000 human rabies deaths occur worldwide of which more than one third are from India. He described, animals transmitting, modes of transmission, signs and symptoms of Rabies. Dr. Praveen Kulkarni, Assistant professor of Community Medicine gave talk on post exposure prophylaxis following dog/animal bites. He detailed do's and dont's following dog/animal bites. There is no single shot vaccination against rabies and and importance of taking five doses of antirabies vaccination and immunoglobulins. Dr. Sunil Kumar D Assistant professor of Community Medicine and NSS officer described pre exposure prophylaxis for Rabies, its importance, who should take vaccination and vaccination among animals. A Rabies education documentary video film was shown. Mr. Nagendra, Medico-Social Worker, Department of Community Medicine, coordinated the event. Dr M R Narayana Murthy, Dr. Prakash B, Professors of Community Medicine Dr. Madhu B, Dr. Vidya G S, Dr. Srinivas B M, Assistant professors of Community Medicine, post graduate students, participated in the event. Special camp Report

JSS Medical College, Mysore

The NSS Unit of JSS Medical College conducted the NSS one week special camp at tribal haadiof Bharathwadi village, Hungodhobli of HunsurTaluk. On 16th march the inaugural function of the camp was held in the presence of dignitaries like Sri Jagadeesh K-Assistant Commissioner who said NSS was the dream of Gandhiji, stay in a village gives us a picture of problems and condition of India. This is a very good opportunity to know the rural India. People say doctors do not want to work in village, but here it is proved that doctors were also interested to work in rural area. We should create an awareness of health and importance of sanitation in the villages, Dr. Keerthi, Taluk medical officer Hunsur, Prof.Gurupadaswamy-, Professorof Economics, Ex-coordinator Maharaja college, Mysore University, Gangadarappa H.V. -NSS coordinator, JSS university, Dara Mahesh-gram panchayath president doddahejjur village and Shahtaj, SDMC president, grampanchyath member of bharathwadi. All dignitaries guided the NSS Volunteers to give awareness regarding national health programs which are available to villagers and tribal people and also to know about the life style and disease patterns among tribal people. The Medical camp which commenced from the 17th march 2014 was spanned over 6 days. Each day saw consultants from different departments like Medicine, Surgery, Paediatrics, OBG, ENT, Ophthalmology and Orthopaedics extended their services from 9.30am to 1 30pm.

Patients were examined by the doctor, the required medicines were dispensed free of cost and if further treatment was needed, were referred to JSS Hospital, Mysore. In addition other services like ECG and Blood glucose test were done. It is with pride that we state that a total of 856 patients received the benefit of these services and medicines were distributed free of cost to the patients. True doctors are not only those who heal but are also those who empower people and play a role in prevention of the disease-with this aim, every afternoon lecture programmes were organized to educate the general public, the young children as well as the NSS volunteers regarding interesting topics of social relevance. Dr. Praveen Kulkarni enlightened about rabies and its prevention, Dr. HugarSiddalingappa who spoke about 'The diseases caused by mosquitoes and its prevention'. DrArunBalamatti, KrishiKignanaKendra, suttur spoke about role of medical graduates in the development of nation. INDIA LIVES IN VILLAGES. 99% of food is produced in villages with lack nutrition. Villages have turned out to be old age homes,

importance of health and life insurance to village people, awareness about having toilets and prevention of open air defecation. Dr.ShrinivasB.M Asst. professor in community medicine and Dr.SomshekharHOD,Post Graduate department of medico social work spoke about Tribal settlements their life style and traditions. Dr.Kavitha created awareness to village people and school children regarding Oral health and hygiene.

The valedictory function was held on the 22nd march DrManjunatha B., Registrar JSS University, Sri Satish Chandra SR Administrative officer, JSS Medical college, Sri Prasanna Kumar HV Head Master, Primary School of Bharathwadi, SmtSheelavathi HM of Ashram School and Sri HangodNataraj press club president were present. It was indeed unique as we went through the lanes of the village, walking amidst the sound of the dhol, enacting the street plays which were on Health education for villagers. Dr Sunil Kumar NSS Program Officer, DrPrashant, DrSiddalingappa and DrHarshith coordinated the whole camp.









JSS Dental College and Hospital, Mysore

With the blessing of his Holiness Jagadguru Sri SriShivarathriDeshikendraMahaswamagalu, NSS camp commenced on 17-2-2014. On the inaugural day we reached Belagola village by 10.30. The accommodation which was provided by the villagers for the purpose of accommodation was cleaned by NSS volunteers. Individual responsibilities were given to each volunteer for seven days regarding special camping activities.

The inaugural function started at 3.00pm in the government school premises. Dr.Manjunatha B, registrar, JSS University, Mysore, inaugurated the special camp by hoisting the NSS flag and lighting the lamp and addressed the NSS volunteers stressing the importance of NSS in rural development. Dr. B Nandalal, the Principal of JSS dental college and hospital, Mysore, was present as the chief guest, who emphasized on the unique blend of volunteers, coming from various corners of the nation and the requirement for the upliftment of general health awareness in rural areas and also shared a few words about the youth empowerment He wished all the NSS volunteers a successful and prosperous camp. Dr. Anil Kumar Gujjari, Vice principal, of JSS Dental College & Hospital and Dr. Dakshayini M.R, Vice principal of JSS Dental College & Hospital, were present in the function.

Dr. Ravi M.B., NSS programme officer, welcomed the guests and highlighted the proposed programs of the camp. The Chief of the village was present at the inaugural function. Sri .B.V.Suresh, President of Gramapanchayat, Belagola, addressed the gathering and added that the villagers were very happy to receive the NSS volunteers and the whole village would support them in the various activities in the upcoming 7 days programme. The programme was concluded with dinner at 9:00pm.

A meeting was held at 10:00pm regarding the daily activity of the camp and also proposed activities for the next day.

Cardiac camp was organized where check-up and treatment was done. About 150 patients were diagnosed and given the treatment.

It was lead by Dr.ArunSrinivas and his dedicated team. On this day, around 75 echocardiograms were done and patients were distributed drugs including calcium, iron, multi vitamins, analgesics, antipyretics and antacids tablets in the camp. The programme went up to 2:00 pm.

Also, throughout the camp, the villagers and the patients who were present in the camp, were examined and educated about the importance of maintaining oral health and its effects on the cardiac health. The lecture was given by Dr. Dakshayini M.R, Vice principal of JSS Dental College and Hospital. About 250 people were educated about the hazards of poor oral hygiene.

The day was scheduled for 'Paediatric and Pedodontic camp' which was lead by the experienced doctors of JSS Medical Hospital and Pedodontist of JSS Dental College and Hospital.

About 300 children, including the students from the Government school and few other children from Belagola village were treated for general and oral health problems. A total of 15 extractions and 135 pit and fissure sealants were done. The children aged between 4 years to 15 years were diagnosed and treated. Around 1000 medicaments were distributed to the children throughout the

day. All children were educated on how to take care of their oral hygiene and brushing demonstrations was given

The chief guest, Smt. Kokila, Deputy- Registrar, JSS University, Mysore, was present on the day. The paediatric camp went on upto 2 pm which was then followed by a talk at 3pm on Women's Health which was vividly given by Dr. Suma K.B. to all the women in the community of the Belogola village. She spoke about the importance of maintaining health, cleanliness, hygiene among women. She stressed mainly about women health and its role in causing various diseases. All the women present for the lecture showed positive response and thanked the NSS team for the arrangement.

The topic for the debate was Child Marriage. The students spoke extremely well and the prize was given to the team that spoke against the children marriage.

Awareness about Oral Health and Hygiene among the village people. The village people were not only given awareness but also screened and treated. About 75 people were diagnosed and treated. About 25 fillings and 30 scaling were performed. The camp and the awareness programme was lead by the experienced dentists of JSS Dental College and Hospital and it went on till 2pm, after which the volunteers and the doctors proceeded for lunch.

It was then followed by a guest lecture, by Professor C.G. Saraswathy, retired Professor of Food and nutrition, Mysore University. She gave a lecture on 'Food and nutrition'. She spoke about the importance of following a proper balanced diet. She also highlighted the importance of fruits and vegetables to help maintain a balanced diet and about the blood related disorders. Sri B.R. Shashikumar and Sri B. Ravi Kumar, both members of the gram panchayat of Belagola, presided the programme. Several villages and staff of JSS Dental College also attended the camp and made the programme a great success.

In the evening, the volunteers were engaged in sports activities like cricket and volleyball with the youth of the village until they were completely exhausted at 8.00 pm.

The dinner was served at 9.00 pm and the daily report was prepared and submitted. A meeting was held at 10.00 pm regarding the Dental camp organized that day, and also discussed about the next day's proposed activities.

Dental health check up by the doctors of JSS Dental College. The camp started at 9.30 am and many people were benefitted from the health checkupprogramme. Around 90 people were benefited, as most of them were given free treatment. Around 20 Extractions, 45 Fillings and around 30 scalings were done. Also, free medicines were distributed to the patients.
