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

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

- 11.2 The NSS PC informed the committee that, MoM of 10th Advisory committee meeting (ACM) was circulated to all members & requested their suggestion/remarks. Since no suggestions/remarks were received, NSS PC sought the confirmation of MoM of 10th ACM. The committee confirmed the MoM of 10th ACM.
